Ahead of our upcoming meeting on Tuesday, June 24, I am sharing the presentation slide deck we'll use to guide our discussion. Please take a few moments to review it beforehand.

At the meeting, we will also step through an interactive dashboard designed to assess the bill impacts of various rate structure changes. This tool will allow us to explore a few scenarios together and better understand how proposed adjustments could affect customers.

I've also included three reference articles to support your continued learning. While some of these are several years old, the fundamentals they cover remain highly relevant—even if rate setting is not quite as top of mind in the water world these days, with PFAS and other issues dominating the spotlight:

- 1. **Water Rates: Past, Present, and New Challenges** (Journal AWWA, 2014 Corssmit) Discusses emerging trends in rate structures and the importance of pricing objectives.
- 2. **Base-Extra Capacity Water Rate Design** (Journal AWWA, 1983 Banker) Offers a detailed explanation of the base-extra capacity methodology we use.
- 3. **Sustainable Water Pricing** (1999 Beecher and Shanaghan)
  Introduces core economic principles of rate setting. Beecher, now retired from the University of Michigan, was a leading expert in water utility policy.
